awrence M. Endres Sr. founded Endres Manufacturing Company in 1926 in Waunakee, Wisconsin. He found early success with his many inventions, including sixteen patents such as a folding drawbar and a disc sharpener. In 1938, Larry Jr. bought the company's first Sears & Roebuck welder and started fabricating steel beams for the increase in home building. This was the beginning of the structural steel business which today makes up over 95 percent of sales. Always looking for new projects, Larry also began a pier business when a friend requested one. He saw it as a great opportunity to keep the employees busy in the winter months. Though the pier business is only a small percent of sales today, it provides a majority of the exposure to the non-construction community.

In 1966, after several additions to the original location, Endres Manufacturing finally grew too big and relocated to an agricultural lot on the edge of Waunakee that could accommodate a shop four times the size of the original facility. When the company moved to the new location, Larry promised to not let the new business become an eyesore to those entering

the village and took it upon himself to give the shop a Bavarian theme to reflect his German heritage.

In 1990, Larry stepped down as president and formally gave the reigns to his son-in-law Ken Ballweg. In 1995 Endres Manufacturing was selected fabricator of the year by the Steel Plus Network, a multinational network of steel fabricators. Endres has grown to an internationally renowned model for superb steel manufacturing.

Business Today

Endres Manufacturing is one of Madison's largest structural steel fabricators. They service primarily Southern Wisconsin but also do plenty of work in parts of Illinois and Northern Wisconsin. They have provided the steel for some of the area's most recognized buildings including The Overture Center, Kalahari Resort, Dane County Airport, several UW-Madison buildings, and countless, high schools, churches, and offices.

Endres is constantly growing and making themselves better. This past year they received their AISC Certification, demonstrating their commitment to quality and to their customers. AISC Certification sets a standard for the

steel industry. Companies that are AISC Certified have been through a rigorous initial evaluation, and are subject to yearly reviews. AISC confirms that companies have the personnel, knowledge, organization, equipment, experience, capability, procedures, and commitment to produce the required quality of work for any size project.

Endres has been a proud member of the AGC since 1982. The AGC has provided Endres with numerous networking opportunities. Endres also values the knowledge they gain by learning what is important to the general con-

Endres Manufacturing is a steel fabricator with unlimited abilities. They are able to handle not only the structural steel but they also specialize in miscellaneous steel. They have nearly as many employees working on stairs and railings as they do on structural members. They recently expanded to make room for the increased demand for long span trusses.

In the Community

Endres Manufacturing's mission states that "doing good in the community and making the world a better place is a part of who they are and what they do". Through their involve-
